The week before Holy Week, our Bishop held virtual meetings with the Clergy and Laity of the Illinois Great Rivers Conference. Bishop Beard has met with us a few times since the pandemic started.

I want to share with you a few things he shared with us.

Much of the meeting was to discuss the upcoming conference schedule. First, our annual conference will be held on Zoom in June, and we will be back to 2 days. The Jurisdictional conference, that determines the number of Bishops as well as bringing in new Bishops to possibly replace retiring Bishops will be meeting in the summer. Lastly the General Conference that was postponed from 2020, is now scheduled for August of 2021 and will be held in Minneapolis. There will be a 1-day virtual meeting in May to determine and approve the operations of our denomination. There will not be any other topics that will be determined, discussed or voted upon at this time.

COVID-19 was also a topic. This is an ever-evolving subject. Currently we can meet in person and sing, but social distancing and masks requirements are still in place. We will now have bulletins. Please remember to sign in and take your temperature and when you leave, please remember to sign out. News from the Pastor

Not sure if I will do this every newsletter, however today I had something come to mind I thought I would share it with you.
